




History of The Communication Command Center

Fukuoka Prefectural Police

1948	Oct	1,	The "Dial 110 Report System" was introduced	
1954	July	1,	Fukuoka Prefectural Police was established.	
1956	Oct	27,	Radio Command Center was attached to the Patrol Division.	
1959	Sept	10,	Radio Command Center was renamed The Communication Command Center attached to the Patrol Division.	
1964	Apr	1,	Communication Command Squad was newly established in Kitakyushu City Police Department.	
1969	Mar	1,	Radio Receivers were introduced.	
1972	Apr	1,	Automobile Patrol Force was attached to a newly established Communication Command Division.	
1974	Apr	1,	Patrol Department was newly established, and the Patrol Division, Communication Command Division, Mobile Patrol Force, and Kitakyushu City Police Department Mobile Patrol Force were attached.	
1975	June	2,	Radio transmitters were introduced at each police station.	
1981	Nov	16,	Police HQ was established and the Communication Command Center was moved to the 6th floor.	
1987	Jan	10,	"Dial 110 Day" was newly established.	
1990	Aug	1,	Fax 110 was introduced for persons with disabilities.	
1993	Apr	1,	Kitakyushu City Police Department Communication Command Squad was abolished and absorbed into the Police HQ Communication Command Division.	
2004	Apr	5,	Police HQ annex building was opened. The Center was moved to the 3rd floor. Car Locater System, Map Information System was introduced.	
2008	Apr	1,	Cellphone Positional Information Notification System was introduced.	
2023	Apr	1,	110 Video Streaming System was introduced.	

Dial 110 Report System

Fukuoka Prefectural Police

Dial 110 is used for an emergency report to police. All the Dial 110 calls in Fukuoka prefecture are to be received in this Communication Command Center, the contents of which are transmitted to patrol cars, police stations and so on by radio. In the case of purse snatching, for example, prompt reporting to the police is necessary for catching suspects and recovering articles, so do not hesitate to call us.



Dial 110 Report System was born in Fukuoka Prefecture

In March 1948, a new police system was established consisting of National Local Police and Self Government Police. On October 1, 1948, Dial 110 Report System was born in the 8 biggest cities: Tokyo, Osaka, Kyoto, Yokohama, Kawasaki, Nagoya, Kobe and Fukuoka. But the dial numbers vary:

In Tokyo:	110
In Osaka, Kyoto and Kobe:	1110
In Nagoya:	118

Emergency call 110 was introduced in Fukuoka City, and calls were received in each police station in Fukuoka City, but at that time, as there was no radio, transmitting to police stations was arranged by telephone.

Dial 110 System of Report

Fukuoka Prefectural Police

Six key points for calling 110

The officer who answers will ask you the following questions. Please answer clearly and calmly:

Point 1

Are you reporting a crime or an accident?
For example, say "robbery," "fight," or "traffic accident."

Point 2

When did it happen?
For example, say "just now" or "5 minutes ago."

Point 3

Where did it happen?
Give the full address if you know it, like "1-2-3 ○○○○ Street, ○○○○ Ward, Fukuoka." If you do not know the address, describe the landmarks like the nearest bus stop or intersection.

Point 4

Who is the perpetrator
Describe things like "the number of criminals, what they were wearing, which direction they fled, license plate number of vehicle," and any other details.

Point 5

What is the current situation?
For example, say if anyone is hurt and how the victim is doing.

Point 6

Who are you?
Give your name, address, phone number, and other details.
